AUCTION RULES

1. Judging sticks and carry cages will not be allowed into the auction room. The birds must not be interfered with or subjected to sticks, pens or similar objects. **NO SMOKING** will be permitted in the auction room at all times.
2. Prior to the start of the auction each intending bidder is required to complete a registration form & receive a bidder's number. The bidder's number will be required to purchase any lots at auction and must be displayed to the auctioneer after the fall of the hammer.
3. All lots will be submitted in the order in which they appear in the catalogue; however, if necessary, the vendor or the organizers reserve the right to make any alterations, additions or deletions to this order.
4. All conditions and warranties expressed or implied by law are hereby excluded and as all lots are open for inspection prior to commencement of the sale, the same are sold with all faults, if any, therefore no compensation shall be made in respect of any fault or imperfection or error of description of any lots sold or otherwise. SQBBA acts as an agent only in respect of the goods being auctioned & is not responsible for any faults, defects or description of any lots.
Intended purchasers must satisfy themselves as to the origin, age or condition of any lot in which they may be interested.
5. Upon the fall of the hammer each lot shall be at the purchaser's risk.
6. After the fall of the hammer no party will be allowed to retract his/her bid.
7. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and in the event of any dispute arising the lot in dispute shall be put up again and the auctioneer's decision shall be final.
8. The auctioneer reserves the right to accept or refuse any bid on birds without having to state the reason or reasons thereof.
9. **Telephone bidding will be available, provided PRIOR ARRANGEMENTS have been made with Mitchell Boal, 0422 698 483, forester_sick@hotmail.com who will arrange for a SQBBA nominated phone bidder to contact you. Payment arrangements for phone bidding must be confirmed PRIOR to the auction.**
10. **Payment** for the goods on the day shall be by **CASH, MASTERCARD, VISA or DIRECT DEPOSIT** unless prior arrangements have been made. There will be a 2% **SURCHARGE FOR CREDIT CARD USAGE**. Personal cheques will not be accepted on the day of the auction without prior arrangement.
11. Successful purchasers of lots will be required to take their purchases with them before or at the completion of the auction. All lots must be removed at the completion of the sale.
12. If any successful bidder shall fail to pay for their purchases on the day, the vendor or his agents have the right to resell the lot in any manner they think proper.
13. Purchases may be collected prior to the completion of the auction providing no additional purchases are made. But please be aware that the auction is still in progress and our admin staff are busy keeping records. If you can please arrange with admin staff for an early pickup.
14. » Take the sales slip & bidding card to the cashier
» Pay for purchases & obtain receipt for your purchases.
» Proceed to the SQBBA Steward at the allocated collection point with your own carry cage and your receipt of purchase.
» Under the supervision of the SQBBA Steward the purchaser will be required to remove the bird/s from the sale cage and transfer it/them to their own cage. Birds must be transferred in transfer cage provided, **no birds to be taken out of show cages outside of transfer cage.**
» The vendor, his agent, the auctioneer or any staff will not be handling the birds. It is the sole responsibility of each purchaser to handle his/her own birds at collection.

OUR VALUABLE VENDORS -

Craig Barnett – Craig is a NSW breeder who has established a line that has had success at the highest level, including numerous Grand Champions and National wins in 2023 and 2025 in the Opaline AOSV class.

Ben Bathols – My passion and addiction to breeding Texas Clearbody birds stems from my original Clearbody bird that I bought from Swan Valley Birds in Western Australia. He was a Jeff Loyd Clearbody who was on his last legs, and I got him for \$10 as a favor from Irene Roberts at the time. He managed to produce a couple of birds, and it went from there. Ben had a very successful Nationals in Cairns in 2025 placing 1st and 3rd in the Clearbody class.

Boal Family – Boal Family consists of Bill (40+ years breeding), Mitchell (20+ years breeding) and Anthony (17+years breeding). Their stud has four main varieties being Yellowface, Lacewings, Clearbodies and Crests. Representing South Queensland, they have had many successes at Nationals level – **2013** - Spangle (1st); **2022** - Normal Grey (7th and 12th), Opaline (12th), Yellowface (1st, 4th & 7th), Clearbody (2nd & 11th), Lacewing (6th), Hen (7th); **2023** - Normal Violet (8th), Normal Grey (8th & 11th), Yellowface (1st, 4th & 5th), Opaline AOSV (8th), Lacewing (2nd, 3rd & 4th), Crest (15th); **2024** – Normal Light Green (3rd), Normal Grey (21st), Yellowface (4th), Opaline (17th), Clearbody (2nd), Crest (2nd); **2025** – Normal Greygreen (15th), Normal Violet (8th), Yellowface (1st & 3rd), Lacewing (4th), Crest (2nd). We have had many National results prior to 2009. The above being the most recent.

John Burt – John owns the INO Lodge in Tasmania and has done well on the Nationals scene with his Inos.

John Carvolth – John is a Novice breeder and has been breeding birds since 2019. He has not attended many shows and has bred budgerigars more as a hobby. The shows he has attended have been very successful. The 2023 Nationals in Ballarat were a highlight with 2 birds being selected in the South Queensland team, with placings of 11th and 15th. Even more rewarding was at the 2025 Cairns Nationals when his lone entry came 1st in the Fallow class. Bloodlines in his aviary consist of Kev O’Callaghan, Smith & Fox, Jeffrey Leong, James Mathews, Matt Holyoak and Armstrong. Favourite varieties are Fallow, Lutino and Aust. Whitecap.

John Ennis – John started breeding in 2006 with culls from local breeders. He has had consistent results over the years in Victorian Diploma Shows and State competitions. He has won 5 National titles with Yellowface, Opaline AOSV, Cinnamon and 2 in Spangle Normal. John breeds 200 – 250 yearly. His goal is to breed birds with modern faces while maintaining size, deportment, health and fertility.

Mark Fellows – Mark and Rebecca are a reclusive husband-and-wife team based in the Hunter valley, NSW, with over 30 years of experience in breeding birds. While they no longer exhibit, their focus remains on producing healthy modern birds of a consistent quality. Operating on a smaller scale than many breeders, they are committed to maintaining high standards and careful selective breeding practices. They always aim to make good quality untried young birds available through auctions.

Gary Gazzard – A widely respected figure in the Australian and International budgerigar fancy, Gary is known for his exceptional breeding success with the modern budgerigar and his prestigious role as an ANBC National Judge. Representing NSW, Gary's dedication to the exhibition of budgerigars spans decades and has earned him a place among the elite in the ANBC Hall of Fame, with a total of 10 National Classes wins. Gary first tasted National success in 1992 with dual class wins in Opaline and Spangle Combined, the latter becoming a class in which he would dominate over the years. His expertise in the Spangle variety is unmatched, claiming 4 wins in the Spangle Combined class – 1992, 1996, 2004 and 2005 – plus a notable win in Spangle D/F in 2004. That same year, he also achieved wins in the Blue class, showcasing the depth and versatility of his stud. Further National titles followed in Greygreen (2005), Hens Class (2007) and a second Opaline win in 2012, rounding out an outstanding career of competitive success. Additionally, to his achievements on the show bench, Gary has made a lasting impact as a Judge at the highest level, having judged at five ANBC National Shows.

Mick Gearing – Have been breeding budgies off and on since I was a youngster. Have had to stop a few times due to work commitments. Have won the State Show on several occasions in Western Australia. I am an Open breeder and competitive at a National level.

2025 – Hens (1st), Dark Eyed Clear (2nd), Dominant Pied (3rd), Lacewings (5th). **2024** – Hens (5th), Lutino (5th). **2023** – Hens (3rd), Recessive Pied (4th), Dark Eyed Clear (5th). My very strong Cinnamon family over the last 4 years have won me 3 Logies – Cinnamon Hen, Opaline AOSV & Cinnamon Pied.

Garry & Helen Hibberd – Garry and Helen received their first ANBC rings in 1991. They competitively moved through the ranks to Open breeders with a stud based on Brian Hollingsworth's birds. In 2018, they ventured to their first Victorian Auction, buying several birds from different breeders. The 2019 Nationals saw them representing South Queensland for the first time, winning their first National Logie with a Lutino. They have represented South Queensland yearly with multiple birds being selected. They have now won 5 National Logies and placing 2nd on a few occasions. Their Lutino's have won 2 of these Logies and have been in the top 4 placings every year since the Nationals resumed after Covid. After buying from many top breeders in Victoria, they found birds from the Rowe Bros. and Peter Thurn worked well with their Brian Hollingsworth birds and made the biggest influence on their birds and continue to source their birds. They are always looking for birds with good features at a realistic price.

Holmes Family – Troy's lifelong passion for budgerigars began in 1987 after catching a budgie in his uncle's market garden, a moment that unknowingly sparked a journey spanning nearly four decades. From a young age, Troy immersed himself in the hobby and his local club while nurturing a keen interest in bird photography. After a ten year hiatus from 1995 to 2005, Troy returned to the fancy with renewed focus. He has been collectively breeding and exhibiting budgerigars for over 29 years and is the current BCSA President as well as an accredited Judge. In recent years, the partnership has been further energized by his fiancée, Kelly, whose hard work and enthusiasm have helped ensure the birds are not just bred, but shown. Together, Troy and Kelly have enjoyed success at a National level, winning 4 National titles in Cairns and earning them an induction into the ANBC Hall of Fame.

Keevers & Hoskinson – Dale and Tiani are the faces behind DT1 Budgerigars. They have been in the hobby for 6 years now. They breed Fallows, Crests and Aust. Whitecaps, along with Normals, Cinnamons, Opalines and Spangles. They have represented South Queensland at the Nationals for five years with Fallows, Crests, Aust Whitecaps and Spangle. They have been successful with National wins with Fallows in Launceston, 2024, and Crest in Cairns, 2025.

Joel Keune – I have been breeding budgerigars for some 10 years and was lucky enough to have the mentorship of Russell & Gloria Toomes. I won 11 consecutive BIS or Best Young Bird titles around South East Queensland. I was fortunate to win a National title and have had some 6 others to represent South Queensland and finish in the top 10. Time is my biggest problem at the moment but hopefully this will improve in the future.

Robin Kirby – In the late 60's and early 70's, like most teenagers in that era, I had budgies. My grandfather had budgies and gave me some to get started. Unbeknown to me at the time, my grandfather's older brother was the first President of the Bendigo Budgerigar and Caged Bird Society in 1933. About 10 years ago, I became interested in budgies again and have steadily improved my birds under the tutelage of long time fancier, Bob Keetelaar and recently some excellent outcrosses from Garry Watson. I have held the position of BC Treasurer since 2023. Recent achievements at Nationals level: – **2019** – Goldenface (7th), **2022** – Goldenface (3rd), **2024** – Dilute (2nd & 6th), **2025** – Goldenface (2nd) & Clearwing (2nd). I mainly focus on Normal Greygreen, Normal Grey & Normal Blue; Goldenface; Dilute; Clearwing; Black eyed Self.

Mick Mann – Mick joined the United Club in Victoria, 8 years ago. He had no idea what he had gotten himself into. Two years of learning and going to shows and auctions, Mick then started to breed show budgies. Mick only houses about 50 birds after a cull each year. He has had 3 Recessive Pies attend the Nationals in **2023**, **2024** and **2025**. At the **2023** and **2025** Nationals, Mick was awarded Best Recessive Pied.

Jeff Orlandi – I have been breeding budgies for 36 years. I am a Champion breeder and have been a senior judge for many years in Victoria. I have won many Victorian Shield classes over the years. National Championships results – **2025** – Australian Goldenface (1st & 9th), **2024** – Spangle AOSV (2nd), **2023** – Australian Goldenface (5th), Normal Violet (9th) Other high placings – Normal Grey (2nd) in Brisbane, Texas Clearbody (3rd) in Parramatta.

Malcolm & Rob Randall – Father/Son Partnership. Involvement within the fancy for over 40 years with first BCV rings ordered in 1984. One of the founding members of the Riverina Budgerigar Society. Champion Status breeders in Victoria and are both ANBC & BCV Senior Panel Judges. Breed around 400 - 500 chicks on average in a season and fly around 600 – 700 birds to have as breeders and to supply auctions. Show awards currently include 10 BCV Diplomas (Best Young in Show), 34 BCV Shield (State Championship) Class wins, 12 BCV Variety Challenge Certificates and BCV National Team Rep on numerous occasions. Some higher placings at National level to date being – 2nd Black Eyed Self, Brisbane in **2019**; 1st Recessive Pied, Victor Harbor in **2022**; 2nd Aust. Whitecap, Cairns in **2025**; 3rd, 3rd & 4th Dilute classes across various years.

Dale Rayner – My first pairing was in October, 1973, as a 12 year old. I have been breeding and selling budgies for the past 53 years. I joined Metropolitan Budgerigar Club of WA (MBC) in 2018 to start showing my birds. After winning numerous awards in Novice and Intermediate, I have advanced this year to show in Open Grade. Highlights so far – February, 2026 WA State Show & Derby – Reserve Best Adult, Best Opposite Sex and Best Young Greywing and Spangle. **2025** ANBC Nationals – Normal Grey Cock (1st). February 2025 WA State Show and Derby – Best Immediate. July 2024 – WA State Show and Derby – Champion of Show, Best Immediate and Best Dominant Pied. One of my favorite shows is the MBC UBC Championship Show which I have won in 2019, 2023, 2024 and Best Reserve 3 times.

Chris & Elena Rogers – Have been breeding budgerigars for over 30 years. Not a frequent shower except for the State Challenge and Nationals. Last year we had 7 birds go to the Nationals in the NSW team and won 2 Logies. We live on the mid north coast of NSW. We breed Normals, Violets, Dilutes, Lacewings, Lutino, Recessives and Dark Eyed Clears.

Jupp & Sheerer – A Grandma/Grandson partnership, being in the hobby for over 30 years. We have shared success at National level, with a win in **2010** (Spangle class), and in **2018** (Normal Grey), with several other top 10 placings. Dan is an aspiring judge, with the hopes of one day becoming a Nationally accredited judge.

Ray Slade - Ray was proudly inducted into the ANBC Hall of Fame – Breeders Excellence Division in 2024, following a remarkable run of success at the ANBC National Show. With a total of seven National class wins, Ray's record reflects his dedication to excellence and his impressive ability to produce top-tier birds across a range of competitive varieties. Ray's first National win came in **2016** with a Blackeyed Self, a class known for its difficulty and exacting standard. The following year, **2017**, Ray successfully won the same class, immediately establishing himself as a breeder of precision and consistency. After 2017, Ray relocated from South Australia to Victoria and became an exhibiting member of the BCV. After several years of dedication and development, Ray made a resounding impact at the **2022** Nationals with an extraordinary four class wins in a single year – claiming top honours in the Normal Green, Normal Grey, Normal Violet and Lacewing classes. In **2024**, Ray added a second Normal Grey class win to his record, bringing his total to seven and securing his well-earned place in the ANBC Hall of Fame.

Anthony Starcevic – Has been breeding budgerigars for the past 14 years in the Wollongong area and has won many awards when attending shows. Anthony's results at Nationals have been - **2018 (Sydney)** – Lutino (11th); **2022 (Adelaide)** – Spangle AOSV (3rd) & Lutino (6th); **2023 (Ballarat)** – Normal Violet (13th) & Dominant Pied (14th); **2024 (Launceston)** – Goldenface (1st) & Normal Greygreen (14th); **2025 (Cairns)** – Spangle D/F (1st & 7th), Spangle AOSV (3rd), Goldenface (6th), Spangle (18th). Anthony has had 14 birds represent NSW at Nationals level and has won 2 logies to date.

Peter Thurn – Peter is an ANBC Hall of Fame member and an ANBC Judge. Peter has 13 wins at National level including wins in the Normal Green, Normal Blue, Opaline, Albino, Clearbody, Fallow and Dilute classes, not to mention numerous seconds and thirds. At State level, Peter has won 81 State Championship classes as well as a few Best & Reserve in Show Awards with the most recent being Best in Show at the Adult State Championships in 2025 with a Spangle. Peter has been BCV President since 2021, is an ANBC Judges Examiner and occasional Auctioneer. Peter works in the livestock genetics industry, specializing in dairy cattle breeding.

Rod Turnbull – Rod is an ANBC Judge having judged at two Nationals (Brisbane, 2019, and Launceston, 2024). Showed in partnership with James Bader under Bader and Turnbull until late 2025. A number of Victorian representations at Nationals with best results being three 2nds (twice in Dilutes in 2022 & 2025) and once in Yellowface (2023). Rod's birds have regularly finished in the top 5 at Victorian State Championships in recent years, especially Dilutes with two 1sts, two 2nds, one 3rd and two other top 6 placings plus the Variety Certificate for Dilutes in 2024/2025.

David Vremec – We show under the name D & M Vremec but are probably more well known on Facebook etc. as DAM Budgerigars. I bred budgies as a boy in the 1980 as a member of the Mountain Districts club and won a Normal Blue class at an UBC Shield before the imports priced me out of the game. I started keeping and breeding budgies again in 2014 when my daughter showed an interest and we have been slowly improving our stud since then. Our favourite varieties are Lacewing, Goldenface and Violets. Initially, work and sporting/coaching commitments meant the showing side of the hobby was neglected but we have begun showing again with the Clyde Budgerigar Society mainly in the Shield competitions. We have achieved good results at these competitions over the last few years culminating in our Lacewing cock winning and our Normal Violet hen placing 2nd at the Cairns 2025 Nationals.

Wayne & Jason Weidenhofer – (Father & Son Partnership) S.A. - Wayne commenced breeding budgerigars in the early 80's and was a consistent top bench breeder in numerous varieties with 4 wins in the equivalent Gardiner Shield. Is now back breeding Clearbodies, Greywings and Aust Goldenfaces to State and National level and is a qualified Judge. Jason commenced breeding in the mid 1990's and rapidly progressed through to an Open breeder at early age. They have represented the State since 2002 and have won numerous Grand Champions/Diplomas at Club and State level with 5 National wins. Their stud is based on power and size with depth of mask through all varieties. Kakoschke & Card bloodlines, together with Champion Victorian breeders, form the basis of the stud. Artificial insemination is not practised nor used in the stud.

Norm Wheatley – Norm is a Western Australian breeder who stands just one win away from ANBC Hall of Fame Status. With a long-standing presence in the Australian budgerigar fancy, Norm has built a reputation for producing birds of exceptional type, consistency and competitive edge. His birds reflect decades of experience, careful selection and an unwavering commitment to the Standard. With multiple ANBC wins already to his name, Norm is knocking on the door of the most prestigious honor in the fancy. His birds continue to place highly at National level and are sought after by serious exhibitors nationwide.

Eric Whitton – Eric is a platinum exhibitor from the NSW Riverina area. Eric started exhibiting budgerigars in 2018 and has represented NSW at the ANBC Nationals with notable achievements: **2022** - Dominant Pied (4th), Aust. Whitecap (6th), Goldenface (6th); **2023** - Normal Grey (1st); **2025** - Normal Greygreen (2nd), D/F Spangle (2nd), Clearbody (5th). Also achieving 3 Grand Champion awards at NSW shows. Eric breeds most varieties.

Barry & Marie Wise – BCV members and Champion breeders located in Finley just above the Vic/NSW border after relocating in the later part of 2023. They have 5 National wins, 5 seconds and many other placings from the 30 plus birds on the National stage. They specialise in Greywing and Lacewings but also have Normals, Opalines, Recessive and Dominant Pies. In the last couple of years have successfully taken on Fallows and DEC varieties that they breed in 30 cabinets. **2025** was a good year with 2 Grand Champion in Show awards plus 2 Diploma winners and Best Bird and Reserve Bird in Show at the BCV UBC Show. From the 2025 Young Bird Shield Selections for the Nationals, their Normal Sky cock was placed 3rd at the Nationals, Greywings placed 1st and 2nd at Nationals and Dilute placed 6th at Nationals.

Steve Wyres – Steve has been a breeder for over 20 years. However, has not entered too many shows, so is still a Novice breeder. Stud based on birds from Troy Holmes, Henry George, Hedra Kamel, Denis Tipping and John Barden. Best result so far 4th Spangle AOSV at 2025 Cairns Nationals, which is the cock I have submitted to this Auction.




